



Paris COP 21

The UN Climate Change Conference (COP21) is taking place from the 30 November to 11 December in Paris, France, and will focus on sustainable development and innovation.









WILPF's mission is to end and prevent war, ensure that women are represented at all levels in the peace-building process, defend the human rights of women, and promote social, economic and political justice.











The small team working on the arrangements for Paris include Heidi Meinzolt (WILPF Germany), Edel Havin Beukes (WILPF Norway), Anita Fisicaro (WILPF Italy & FAO

Representative), Sophie Morel (WILPF France)

and Nancy Price (WILPF US) with several other members offering advice.

We expect a good sized WILPF delegation including women from France, Germany, Norway, US and Italy. Do let us know if you will also be there. The WILPF organising team have encountered a series of challenges relating to security issues following the recent attacks in Paris, but they are resolved to do what they can in Paris.
